Due to the extremely fragile nature of the babies we serve, we have strict requirements and expectations of our donors. If you are interested in donating your excess breast milk, please review the details below to help determine if one of our programs is right for you.



In-Depth Qualification Process

To determine breast milk donation eligibility, applicants should be prepared to complete a thorough screening process.



Steps to Apply

Donation eligibility requires successful completion of a pre-screening questionnaire, a medical history application, health confirmation forms from the mother's physician and baby's pediatrician, blood test, DNA sample, and freezer test. If the donor's baby is less than six months old, the health confirmation from the pediatrician will be used to confirm that the baby is exclusively fed your breast milk.*

*Unless your infant is medically unable to consume breast milk.



Strict Sanitization Requirements

Donors are required to consistently follow strict pumping guidelines, which include washing pump parts after each use and sanitizing them at least daily. Detailed guidelines are provided upon successful completion of a pre-screening questionnaire.



Donation Commitment

Applicants are expected to have a consistent supply of excess breast milk.
